



Wider countryside species can occur almost anywhere where the larval food plant is available and are therefore more widespread. For habitat specialist the provision of larval foodplant alone is insufficient to support the species and other environmental factors are required.

Adonis Blue	Chalk downland
Brown Hairstreak	Where blackthorn is abundant
Chalkhill blue	Chalk downland
Dark Green Fritillary	Open chalk downland
Dingy Skipper	South facing chalk hillsides and woodland clearings
Duke of Burgundy	Sheltered chalk downland with abundant promroses
Grayling	Single site in Sussex at Deep Dene
Green Hairstreak	Scrubby chalk grassland & some woodland clearings & heaths
Grizzled Skipper	Warm sheltered habitats: downland and wood edges
Pearl-bordered Fritillary	Woodland clearings with dog violet
Purple Emperor	Deciduous woodland, often oak, but with willow
Purple Hairstreak	Oak woodland
Silver-spotted Skipper	Very warm chalk grassland with short turf
Silver-studded Blue	Heathlands where heather is sparse such as ridge edges
Small Blue	Sheltered sites with Kidney Vetch
Small Pearl-bordered Fritillary	Damp woodland clearings with dog violet
Wood White	Single site in Sussex
White-letter hairstreak	Where there are elms
